

## Forklift License Alberta

Forklift License Alberta - In North America, getting a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over certification, training and license for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can get a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come with various alternatives, like for example stand-up and sit-down. There are different sizes and types of forklift suitable for different industrial applications. Operator training programs are often individualized in order to address the particular kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift in a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The variety of forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to focus on particular course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to acquire their forklift certification or license. This particular method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on equipment within the workplace. Employers may choose to train personnel on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The program incorporates forklift operation methods, safety measures, company policies and lift truck maintenance. Topics particular to the worksite, like dangerous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually needs an on-site component with hands-on practice.

Typically, a certification provided by an employer would not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

The most important aspect of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one kind of machine to another. Safety problems vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for example in offshore and marine operations.
