Telehandler Training Courses Alberta - Employers are responsible for ensuring that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work proficiently with telehandler equipment. The skill level of staff need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers need to provide training so that employees attain the necessary level of skill. The level of responsibility of the person should be considered when training is provided. Effective training will remedy whatever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training can be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Federal, state/provincial and local rules set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, the use of different attachments, or the operation of rotating machines. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance like any other equipment. The equipment will wear out eventually, so right maintenance is required to guarantee the safe utilization of the telehandler machine. Checks and inspections are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to rectify, monitor and prevent problems associated with wear, deterioration and damage. Personnel require competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be seriously viewed and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the machine. General maintenance is usually carried out by the telehandler owner while pre-use inspections are normally done by the user.
